A Message from Chris

So you think you have a bad job...

I have said more times than I can remember that in my opinion Jeremiah had the worst job as a prophet ever. God had called him to preach to His people, which doesn't seem too bad until you have all the information about the situation.

- The nation claimed they were "innocent" and had "not sinned." (Jeremiah 2:35)
- The nation was so off target with their relationship with God that He called them "fools," "foolish children," that they were "skilled in doing evil," and they "do not know how to do what is good." (Jeremiah 4:22)
- The nation believed that because they were the "People of God," He wouldn't do anything to them. (Jeremiah 5:12)
- 4) God told Jeremiah to stand in the gate of the house of the Lord and "call out to them" as they were going into worship and tell them that they needed to correct their ways. (Jeremiah 7:2-3)
- 5) God told Jeremiah not to pray for the people, because He would not listen. (Jeremiah 7:16)
- 6) The final thing that tips the scale to make it the worst job ever is that God told him that when he preaches to them "they will not listen to you, and when you call, they will not answer you." (Jeremiah 7:27)

When you put all of this together, Jeremiah was called to minister and preach to people that he couldn't pray for, they would not listen, and they would not answer. He would see absolutely no fruit for any of his labors. How depressing would that be?

Have you ever felt that way... that all the cards were stacked against what you were supposed to be doing, and when it came down to it you knew deep down within you that nothing was going to come of it? However, that

is not the point, is it? So what is the point? One word: **OBEDIENCE**. What God wanted out of Jeremiah was simply that: obedience, and it is the same thing he wants out of us. It's not about the fruit you may or may not see, it is about being willing to follow God regardless of the outcome. Here are some verses (NIV) to keep in mind:

- If you love me, keep my commands. John 14:15
- Peter and the other apostles replied: "We must obey God rather than human beings!" Acts 5:29
- In fact, this is love for God: to keep his commands. And his commands are not burdensome, John 5:3
- If you are willing and obedient, you will eat the good things of the land; Isaiah 1:19

> Valentine's Day is celebrated on February 14th every year. It is a day when people express their love and affection for one another.

Valentine's Day is celebrated in Canada, Mexico, the United Kingdom, France and Australia. In Great Britain, Valentine's Day began to be popularly celebrated around the 17th century.

By the middle of the 18th, it was common for friends and lovers of all social classes to exchange small tokens of affection or handwritten notes, and by 1900 printed cards began to replace written letters due to improvements in printing technology. Ready-made cards were an easy way for people to express their emotions in a time when direct expression of one's feelings was discouraged. Cheaper postage rates also contributed to an increase in the popularity of sending Valentine's Day greetings.

Americans probably began exchanging hand-made valentines in the early 1700s. In the 1840s, Esther A. Howland began selling the first mass-produced valentines in America. Howland, known as the "Mother of the Valentine," made elaborate creations with real lace, ribbons and colorful pictures known as "scrap." **Today,** according to Hallmark, an estimated **145 million Valentine's Day cards** are sent each year, making Valentine's Day the second largest card-sending holiday of the year (more cards are sent at Christmas).
