Why Easter Sunday Matters

Some people go to church to show off their new clothes on Easter Sunday. But believers across the world gather to offer praise and thanksgiving as they celebrate our Lord's glorious victory over death, hell and the grave! Cries of "Hallelujah, He is risen!" ring out in the halls of cathedrals, from behind pulpits, and within the walls of our churches; they soar around the globe on broadcast services, and rise up from choir lofts, as singers lift their voices to sing of our Redeemer and conquering King. Yes, Hallelujah! He is risen!



But before God's awesome display of resurrection power raised Christ from the dead, the Savior had to walk that long, lonely road leading to Calvary. It was on that dark and dangerous road, through a journey of sorrow and suffering, that Christ willingly went to the cross. There He died for our sins, paying the ultimate price for our redemption.

Not one of us can imagine what happened that day at the cross. For all of the times we've read the story in the Bible, all of the paintings we've ever seen, all of the dramatizations we've ever watched, we're still left with only inadequate glimpses of what Jesus endured for us.

Following His death, the lifeless body of our Lord was taken from the cross and laid in a borrowed tomb. But sometime between the sun going down on their grief on

Following is an excerpt from the Enka Baptist Church History (1929—1979) and the Minutes of May 28, 1941:

"On May 28, 1941, Treasurer and Chairman of the Finance Committee, Robert R. Barnes, gave the treasurer's report and presented the committee's proposed church budget for 1941-1942, which follows.

Barnes made the motion that the budget be accepted. Hubert Carter made the second. Motion carried. On this same evening the coming Vacation Bible

School was discussed."
