presented on Thursday night and six came forward with decisions. Out of those six decisions, three were first time commitments to Christ and we are in the process of following up with them on baptisms.


"Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." Matthew 19.14 (NIV)






In Every Pew Sits a Broken Heart: Hope for the Hurting by Ruth Graham

Is There a Broken Heart in Your Pew? Have you ever thought, as I have, that "if only Billy and Ruth Graham

had been your parents you would have struggled much less with sin and been much wiser?" I tend to put people I admire up on



pedestals – even though I know 2 Corinthians 10:12 says, "they who compare themselves among themselves are not wise." So, when I read this memoir from Billy Graham's third child, Ruth, I was blessed by her transparency describing her life going against loved one's advice and not listening – thinking she needed to do what was best for herself and then reaping the sad consequences of distress and pain later on. She shares her secret fears, doubts, disappointments, and feelings of isolation and how God ultimately helped her. She also describes, in detail, how the reader can wisely counsel others by going through hard times. I raced reading this engaging book and came away reminded and encouraged that life and its troubles can happen to anyone – I was more able to fully forgive my own poor choices in the past! This is an A+ book that I highly recommend, and it is available in our church library!
