God's Word must be passed on to those who aren't as far along as we are in our Christian walks. Through formal discipleship programs or informal




times of sharing God's Word, giving counsel, and praying together, let your life guide someone closer to Jesus. Ask God to duplicate Christ's likeness in you, then through you!

#### IS SERVING GOD IMPORTANT?

We find purpose in serving because God has called us and our time has come. Our desire to serve blossoms from the spiritual gifts God has bestowed on us as well as our gratitude for the many ways He blesses us.



First Peter 4:10 states, "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms." And 2 Timothy 1:6 says, "Stir up the gift of God which is in you."

#### WHAT IS LABOR DAY?

Labor Day is celebrated on the first Monday in September. It's a day dedicated to the everyday worker. This holiday gives tribute to the working class and their contributions to the strength, prosperity, and well-being of our country. Labor Day became an official national holiday in 1894. Its roots can be traced back to the Industrial Revolution and the labor movement activists of the late 19th century. These activists fought for workers' rights through organized strikes, demonstrations, and rallies focused on improving working conditions.

Many modern employee benefits, including the 40-hour workweek, paid time off, sick leave and workplace safety, were made possible through the labor movement. Labor Day celebrates American workers, unions and labor leaders.

This holiday is usually celebrated with summer activities such as swimming, camping, picnics, etc. Labor Day is the unofficial end of summer in the Northern part of the U.S. Many schools start sometime just before or just after Labor Day.

The first Labor Day holiday was celebrated on Tuesday, September 5, 1882, in New York City, in accordance with the Central Labor Union.
